DEP Commissioner McCabe Announces Three New Appointments

The AEA would like to pass on the following information issued by the state Department of Environmental Protection (DEP).

DEP Commissioner Catherine McCabe recently announced three new appointments to the Department.



First, Jane Rosenblatt has joined the Commissioner's Office staff as the Deputy Chief of Staff. Jane spent seven months as a cabinet liaison in the Governor's Office of Cabinet Affairs and Operations, where she facilitated coordination between the Office of Governor and the DEP, Department of Transportation, Office of Homeland Security and Preparedness, and the Board of Public Utilities.

Jane has staffed Jersey Water Works (JWW) tables at two AEA spring conferences, and she has worked with several AEA members who actively participate in JWW. Among those are Peggy Gallos, executive director, who is on the JWW steering committee.

Before joining the Office of Governor, Jane was a program manager and coordinator at New Jersey Future from 2014 to January 2018 and a project specialist at Sustainable Jersey from 2013 to 2014.

In addition, the DEP will be creating a new position of Associate Commissioner for Policy on the Commissioner's staff. Kati Angarone will serve in that role on an acting basis.

Kati joined the DEP in 1997 as an environmental specialist interpreting and implementing land use regulations. Most recently, Kati had been overseeing emergency response, as well as rule and policy development in the Director's Office in the Division of Water Supply and Geoscience.

Finally, Rohini C. Gandhi has returned to the DEP as the new Director of the Office of Diversity, Equal Opportunity and Public Contract Assistance.

Since joining the Attorney General's Office of Equal Employment Opportunity in 2014, Rohini has supervised investigations into complaints of employment discrimination, analyzed employment complaints and trained Office of Attorney General employees on employment discrimination laws and policies.

Enter to be recognized in the One Water Awards

BPU to hold public meeting on underground facilities

The Staff of the Board of Public Utilities (Board) is inviting interested parties and members of the public to a stakeholder meeting to discuss the re-adoption of the Board's rules, entitled "**Underground Facilities: One-Call Damage Prevention System**" as set forth in N.J.A.C. 14:2.

As part of this process, a number of issues will be analyzed, including, but not limited to, operator responsibilities, excavator responsibilities and other best practices.

This meeting is a follow up meeting to the March 22, 2018 and May 21, 2018 stakeholder meetings in which multiple issues were brought up by the participating stakeholders.

For this specific stakeholder meeting, issues pertaining to N.J.A.C. 14:2-3.1 through N.J.A.C. 14:2-3.6 will be discussed.
