DOT Proposes Rules Governing Abandoned Pipes

The NJ Department of Transportation is proposing regulations (PRN 2019-038) related to abandoned pipes.

According to the rule announcement in the NJ Register, "proposed N.J.A.C. 16:25-8.10, Abandonment of pipelines, is added to provide guidelines related to abandoned pipelines. The language states that the Department does not own any of the abandoned pipelines and provides the methods, including removal, purging, and filling, which may be used to remedy situations involving them."
