WATER, REST AND SHADE GETTING THROUGH THE SUMMER MONTHS

Heat-related illnesses can be prevented. Prevention requires employers and workers to recognize heat hazards. Management should commit to:

Take extra precautions to protect new workers.

- Train supervisors and workers to control and recognize heat hazards.
- Determine, for each worker throughout each workday, whether total <u>heat stress is too high</u>, both from the conditions of that day and recognizing carryover effect possibilities.
- Implement engineering and administrative controls to reduce heat stress.
- Provide sufficient <u>rest</u>, <u>shade</u>, <u>and fluids</u>.
